This year the University of Canterbury is delighted to launch the great Kiwi English, Maths and Science Competitions for primary, intermediate and secondary schools. The Kiwi competitions are written by New Zealand teachers for New Zealand students and are based on the NZ curriculum. The online competitions will be run in the last 2 weeks of Term 2. All participating students will be awarded a certificate and medals will be awarded to top students in each year group. The cost for a student

to participate is \$8.50 per competition entered, however school will pay \$3.50 of this, bringing the cost to parents down to \$5 each – thanks to Festival funds. These competitions will replace the ICAS (Austalian) tests we have previously offered to year 7 & 8 students. These NZ Competitions provide an opportunity for Year 5/6 and Y7/8 to participate. Talk to your child's class teacher or Ali if you are interested in entering your child in any of these competitions.

A safety query Are you happy for your child to be riding a bike without covered shoes?
