Health Survey follow-ups: Wearing shoes, or not, to school: Our recent survey gave us an interesting view of your thoughts on this. There is an even split between parents who think wearing shoes should be compulsory (especially in winter) and parents who commented that it is great that wearing shoes is not compulsory!

- Teachers would prefer that children had shoes on to come to school in the winter, but we will not enforce this. If we are concerned about an individual child's health and we believe that wearing shoes will be of benefit, then we will talk to the parents or caregivers.

- We would expect children who have been away from school with colds or flu to be wearing shoes on their return to school.

- We find that children with cold feet have more incidents such as stubbed toes or sore feet during fitness activities on the cold concrete in the mornings.

- Thanks to the generosity of some community knitters, there are woolly slippers available for in-class use for Rooms 3 and 4.

- Gumboots are not ideal at school because they make it more difficult for children to participate in fitness activities.
- Whenever we take students in to town, we do expect them to wear shoes.
- It would be great if shoes and socks could be named as we often end up with a collection in our Lost Property box!
