Health survey follow-up: Lunch eating procedures. Thanks to the parents who raised some questions about expectations at lunch times.

- We encourage students to bring a healthy lunch and to eat most of what is provided from home. We do not encourage children to
 share food with others because we believe that if parents send food for their child to eat, then they expect their child to eat it not
 somebody else! No child ever needs to go hungry because if there is ever a child who has no lunch (forgotten lunch box or no food at
 home) then a staff member will make sure we find some lunch for that child.
- During lunch times teachers are part of a supervision roster. Because of feedback, teachers now understand that so long as a child has eaten something, and the child says he or she has had enough, then that is ok. All students are expected to sit down in the lunch area for 10 minutes or so, to eat lunch.
- Food that is not eaten, and any lunch waste, is expected to go home. This means that parents can see what has or has not been eaten. If you find a lot of food is coming home, perhaps you are sending too much food for your child at school.
- Water is the drink of choice at our school, although there are some opportunities for students to have the option of Fonterra milk.
