COCONUT ICE MICE- Written by Emma and published by Nikau

Ingredients:

1 can of condensed milk
3 ½ cups of icing sugar
4 cups of desiccated coconut
Vanilla essence (optional)
Red food colouring
White chocolate buttons
Red or black strap licorice
Silver cachous or currents



Method:

Get a few trays or plates & and line them with grease proof paper. Combine the condensed milk with the icing sugar (you may need another half cup) coconut and & vanilla mix well. Add more coconut or icing sugar to give a firm consistency. Split the mixture in half. Add red colouring to one half & mix well. Mould the mix into mousey looking shapes and place on your lined plates or tray. Then get busy adding the mousy details. Cut a milk button in half and place at the head end for ears. Add eyes (Silver Cachoes or currents). Add a little talk made from licorice. Push them in as they have a tendency to fall out! Freeze your mice to set. Then eat!
