Social netball Wow! What an amazing response, we are now looking at two teams, so still room if anyone else is keen. You now need to start thinking of a name for our teams.



If you are new to Ngatimoti School and this sounds a bit daunting, please don't panic!



Fantastic Beasts is a movie based on the book by JK Rowling from the World of Harry Potter. The screenplay is written by her too.

The main characters are Newt Scamander, Jacob Kowalski, Tina and Queenie Goldstein, and Frank. It is set in 1920s New York and Grindelwald is at large. The Ministry of Magic is trying to sort everything out, but Grindelwald keeps attacking. Everyone is panicking.
