

Parents and Teacher Aides are the people who sometimes feel the least able to help children or students who seem to be such a puzzle - these are the children who have quite different learning needs to most other children.

This course is designed to interest, support and educate Parents and Teacher Aides in the latest research, teaching materials and local resources. We hope to support the people, who work or live with students with specific learning difficulties, in a practical way.

Programme

Sue Michell - What is it like to have or live with someone with a specific learning difficulty? How might it affect learning and life in general?

Ross Vennell - A research scientist at the Cawthron Institute, will share his own experiences. Kelvin Hardaker - A local RTLB, reflects on current support within local schools - what is available and who can help?


