All classes have enjoyed visits to Nelson Museum and Bishops School this week. Thank you for all your amazing parent support! This display at the museum, beautifully modelled by Chase from Room 1, was for learning about the past through photographs. We saw an old camera, and compared it to a cell phone camera for size. We learned that the negatives were on glass slides. Props were used in olden day photographs, which were often taken indoors. We saw photographs of children sitting on taxidermy sheep, with kittens, birds, and puppies, and painted landscape backgrounds with trees, hills and the sky.

School Days - the good, the bad and the ugly It has been great to see and hear so many positive comments about our students and their RIVER values recently. On the museum visits this week, most students showed respect for others, a positive attitude to learning and great responsibility for their own behaviour. Parents, you should be proud that your children are living up to the expectations you have of them. Unfortunately we can't always be as good as we should be. We all have a grumpy day every now and then, and most of us know how to stay away or not exacerbate the situation if someone 'got out of bed on the wrong side'. Unfortunately there are one or two students who are becoming known for this type of behaviour, and it can become ugly. If your child feels worried, scared, or threatened, we have two things to do. Firstly, we need to reassure your child that he/she is not a victim and does not need to behave like one. Don't take the nastiness personally - it is the person who is delivering it who often has the biggest problems. At school we teach children to use their WITS (Walk well away, Ignore, Talk to a friend or Seek help from a teacher). Secondly, at school and at home, we need to work with the perpetrator. This is an important part of learning for many children. This can take a long time. Please contact Ali if you need to talk more about any forms of mean, nasty or 'ugly' behaviour at school.
