Ngatimoti Festival The Festival is coming up very soon, and for those parents who are new to this, the following should be useful reading. Seventeen years ago, the parent group decided to have one big fundraiser for the year, rather than many smaller attempts during the year to raise funds. The

Festival was decided upon because it means we are making money from a wide variety of people, not just locals! The festival does mean that we need <u>all</u> parents on board though, as every pair of hands helps. However, you look at it, the Festival is a fantastic event for our community. We do need to rely on parents' generosity (particularly their time) and goodwill. Some parents offer to do over and above their fair share, and they do this for the general good of the school, your children and our community. Thank you!

Over the past few years, the Festival profits have meant that parents are not asked for money to contribute towards things such as

- Stationery for your children (exercise books, pens, pencils etc.)
- A class photo for your children
- Shows such as Red Riding Hood and John Crick
- Sports shirts
- Musical instruments
- Employing specialist teachers for such subjects as dance and drama
- Teacher Aides in classes to support learning
- Trips to places such as the Nelson museum
- We are also subsidising school camps

Over the years, profits have also gone to bigger items, such as the kitchen in the Hall, the swimming pool fence and the green round climbing frame on the bottom field. More recently, the BOT have installed a solar water system to heat the swimming pool and bought the school van. In the past few years, we have contributed something towards the wider community too, such as the local defibrillators, a contribution to the Motueka swimming pool and the Motueka Weedbusters.

Tomato Varieties

<u>Black Cherry</u> Plum sized cherry tomato that when ripe turns a dark reddish/black. Prolific producer & delicious! Awesome snack size for the kids.

<u>Round Red</u>, A great medium sized tomato, which is free of cracking and blemishes. Great flavor and perfect for eating fresh or bottling

Money Maker Needs no intro. Produces lots of fruit over a long period of time

Yellow Scottish

A good one - vigorous, healthy plant that produces well. Good flavour and keeps well when left on the vine. Round yellow tomato that goes a deep dark yellow when fully ripe.

Heritage

Huge tomatoes, my biggest one last year weighed 600g!! Fruit deep dark red. Flesh good taste. Strong plants that need staking.

<u>Yellow Brandywine</u> This one is a big yellow tomato that turns almost orange when left on the vine to fully ripen. Very fleshy fruit & good flavour.

<u>Aussie Red</u> A good-sized tomato, which is rich in flavour, healthy plant and seems to do quite well even in colder conditions. Awesome for bottling, good producer

Yellow Pear Small snack size yellow pear shaped tomato. Good producer

Boxes: Please keep any small sturdy boxes, which might be good for putting plants in on festival day.
