<u>Our Strategic Plan</u> Last year the BOT surveyed all parents and from this our strategic goals for the next 3 years were developed. The full strategic plan can be seen on our school website. We have 5 goals, wellbeing, identity, creativity, literacy and numeracy. One significant theme that arose from the surveys was that parents want their children to be happy. This year, as a part of our curriculum plan we have an overarching theme of Happiness. Discussions around what makes us happy, what makes other people happy and how to look at life in a positive way will be regularly included in classroom discussions.

GOAL 1: Well Being. We want our students to be healthy and active contributors

- 1. Think in a considered way about their actions and decisions.
- 2. Be prepared to try new things, problem solve and take calculated risks.
- 3. Show kindness towards others.

GOAL 2: Identity.We want our students to understand where they fit in the world.

- 1. Value the environment and show a responsibility for our natural environment.
- 2. Practise tikanga Māori.

GOAL 3: Creativity. We want our students to learn there are many ways to achieve.

- 1. Be able to connect and respond on a personal level.
- 2. Have the courage and conviction to offer opinions.

GOAL 4: Literacy. We want our students to be inspired readers and writers.

1. Use reading, writing, speaking and listening to gain and use knowledge to understand and expand horizons.

GOAL 5: Numeracy. We want our students to be competent and confident mathematical learners.

- 1. To be able to use and apply maths facts and knowledge
- 2. Confidently speak using mathematical thinking

All experiences at school fall under these headings. For example, the waka trips are actually about being prepared to try new things (Well being), valuing the environment and practising tikanga Māori (Identity), achieving in many ways (Creativity), speaking and listening to understand and to expand their horizons (Literacy) and being able to apply maths facts and knowledge (Numeracy).

NETBALL SEASON 2019

The new futureFERN Netball programme has been designed by Netball New Zealand to meet the needs of young players from years 1 through to 8, modifying the game so that the game grows with the players.

Years 1&2

Skill sessions for this age group will be run one lunch time per week throughout term two, focusing on FUNdamental movement skills with the introduction of basic netball skills. The cost for the term will be \$25.

Years 3&4

Focusing on 'learning' the basics of Netball, designed to be fast and fun maximising participation. Players will have one skill session at School per week (time to be decided), followed by another skill session and modified small-sided game on a Saturday at the Motueka Netball courts. Cost for the season is \$35.

Years 5&6

Stepping up to the next level with the focus still being on 'learning' the basics of Netball. Skill sessions will be held once a week after school followed by a modified game at the Motueka Netball courts on a Saturday. Cost for the season is \$50

Years 7&8

Stepping up to 7 aside, full netball rules apply at this age. There will be a training session once a week after school on a Friday, and a competition game on a Saturday. Cost for the season is \$80
