YAY we have been given the 'big tick' from TDC and so we are finally able to use our lovely old Hall. Actually, it is no longer called the Hall. It is now to be known as Rathgar House. This more dignified name comes from the name of the farm our school land is on - Rathgar Farm.

This building was originally a farmhouse on what was once a farm called Rathgar Farm. Rathgar is a village close to Dublin in Ireland. An Irish widow called Margaret emigrated from Ireland to Nelson with her two sons. On the journey she fell in love and went on to have more children. Sadly, after settling in Nelson, her new husband died. She then met Mr McGaveston, the man she would spend the rest of her life with. They had eight children together and they farmed in various places around the Motueka Valley. This farm they named Rathgar Farm, after Margaret's home town. They built this as their house around 1909.

This building has been used as a school Hall and occasionally as a classroom in previous years. It belongs to the school community and is not maintained by the Ministry of Education. In 2018 the Board of Trustees decided to upgrade it. The whole building has been earthquake strengthened, insulated, re-piled and a new verandah and deck have been built.

The Ngatimoti School Student Council are really grateful to everyone who helped give this building a new life. Special thanks to the Board of Trustees and everyone who has worked on the Ngatimoti Festival for a number of years to help pay for the renovations. Thanks also to Mr. Ed Stevens who helped research the history of Rathgar Farm before it was a school and thanks to our local signwriter, Mr Peter Laufkotter who is making new signs for the building. The Student Council have enjoyed being a part of this learning journey, finding out local stories and helping with some of the design. They asked for suggestions for a new name. Mr Guthrie Beatson suggested Rathgar House because of the history.
