

Welcome back to School It is great to have so many happy and settled students back at school. The classrooms and playground seem to be happy places, which is what we want for everyone. Please let us know if there is anything we can help with to make sure your child is in a happy place!

Learning this term Thanks for the great turnout of family members to finish last term with our astonomical science showcase. This term we are coming back to Earth, with class studies about native birds, Motueka history and then world cultures. The term will also include Technology Challenges, tennis and also various winter sports, an Art week, lots of enviro activities and then we will finish with Pet Day.

Room 1 and 3 parents will have one further opportunity to participate in the Reading Together programme. We would love it if you could make this a priority!

Enviro To begin this term we have four enviro-sessions, with all students in a group working with others from across the school. Student leaders will run these groups, and students have had a choice as to which area of learning they prefer. The groups are stream monitoring, Thorn's wetlands, Bark Bay signage, Bark Bay app, gardens and zero waste. As well as these enviro-learning sessions, each class is learning about native birds. We hope to also hear from an ornithologist and to learn about kaka and pateke releases in the Abel Tasman National Park. Next week on Tuesday, Room 5 students have an opportunity to head to Bark Bay to do some planting, and on Thursday Rooms 1 and 3 are planning a trip to Natureland to see the kaka there.
