Health Survey Thank you to those of you who took the time to

complete our health survey. Our Board of Trustees will discuss any issues arising in due course.

- Pet Day Friday 27 September. Next Friday morning. Parents are encouraged to come along and join in the fun! All dogs brought to school need to be tied up along the back tree-line area. (well separated from other dogs!) 1.
- Lambs, goats, calves and ponies should be tied up on the bottom field.
- 2. Only bring your dog if it is safe around kids, other animals and other dogs.
- 3. Bring your own water container and food (if necessary) for your pet.
- 4. Please don't lead your dog all around. Leave it tied up and people can come and visit it!
- 5. Any poo or mess is the responsibility of the person who entered the pet!
- 6. Remember to look after your pet and not let it get stressed out.
- 7. No dogs can come on the bus. If you have a smaller animal that will STAY in its cage on the bus, you can ask your bus driver, Ian or Juliette if that will be ok.
- 8. Pets need to be taken home by lunchtime.
- 9. If you want to pat someone else's animal, you must ask the owner's permission. This is for your own safety.

Some categories for judging could be whitest/ blackest, most stubborn/ best behaved, fluffiest ears/perkiest ears, waggiest tail/ longest tail, nicest eyes/ cuddliest, noisiest/ quietest, biggest/ smallest, looks most like its owner, cleanest etc.


