<u>Kaka Release</u> Yesterday 8 of our ATYA students had a fantastic day at Bark Bay, for the release of 12 kaka. Not only did we watch as the kaka were released from the purpose built aviary, but we brought in 8 more birds that had flown (via Air NZ!) from Christchurch, and were then released into the aviary. They will be released into the wild in 2 weeks time.

What a privilege it was to have our students involved in this occasion, with opportunities to work and learn from iwi members, Project Janzsoon, the Department of Conservation, members of the Abel Tasman Bird Song Trust and the media.

<u>Pet Day</u> THIS Friday 27 September. Parents are encouraged to come along and join in the fun from 9am. Please arrange for all live pets to be taken home by lunchtime. Children are welcome to bring along stuffed toys, pet rocks or other inanimate pets!!

- All dogs brought to school need to be tied up along the back tree-line area. (well separated from other dogs!) Lambs, goats, calves and ponies should be tied up on the bottom field.
- 2. Only bring your dog if it is safe around kids, other animals and other dogs.
- 3. Bring your own water container and food (if necessary) for your pet. Lamb owners, please bring your milk if you want to enter a 'fastest drinking lamb' competition.
- 4. Please don't lead your dog all around. Leave it tied up and people can come and visit it!
- 5. Any poo or mess is the responsibility of the person who entered the pet!
- 6. Remember to look after your pet and not let it get stressed out.
- 7. No dogs can come on the bus. If you have a smaller animal that will STAY in its cage on the bus, you can ask your bus driver, Ian or Juliette if that will be ok.
- 8. Pets need to be taken home by lunchtime.
- 9. If you want to pat someone else's animal, you must ask the owner's permission. This is for your own safety.
