TOMORROW, Thursday 24 August, 7 pm, all parents are welcome to a health curriculum meeting here in Room 5.

This will have a significant focus on the sexuality aspect of our curriculum, and although aimed mostly at the learning the older students will do, all parents are most welcome. We expect this meeting to last approximately one hour. Sexuality education is much more than learning about 'the birds and the bees'. It includes learning about biology, as well as friendships, relationships and some social issues. Society is changing, so schools are adapting to address some new challenges that young people are facing. These can include things like dealing with social media responsibly, and the growing understanding that there are different sexualities and sexual orientations. Sexuality education helps everyone to develop the skills, attitudes and understandings necessary to share a positive environment at school.

Sexuality education in Years 1, 2 and 3 is generally woven into regular learning topics.

Our sexuality programmes include physical aspects, relationships, stereotypes and online safety. At all levels, our aim is to promote respect to ensure all students and their whānau feel included, and to work towards developing empathy for others.

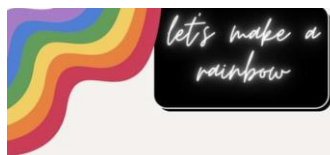
