This week it is Māori Language Week, and the theme is Kia Kaha Te Reo Māori — making the language stronger. At Ngatimoti School, we are building on our enviro-learning last week about Huriawa and Whakarewa, and retelling pūrākau to all classes. "Pūrākau are a part of Māori symbolism, culture, and world views, and include philosophical understandings and thinking, cultural norms, and behaviours fundamental to Māori views of self and identity." (Rameka 2016). Did you know that Māui is a very significant character for our rohe? He is honoured for his personal traits of quick wittedness, bravery, and knowledge by iwi here in Te Tauihu. Maybe you could find some of the stories of Māui to talk about with your children?

Next Monday 18 September, our Room 4 and 5 students will travel to Motueka Recreation Centre for the morning, travelling on a free bus provided by the Clued-Up Kids programme organisers. Clued Up Kids is a multi-agency programme teaching primary school-aged children confidence and life skills to help them stay safe in a range of real-life scenarios. They will return to school in time for lunch at 12.30pm.


The hands-on activities include a 'shaky house' for practising what to do in an earthquake, a smoky fire simulation teaching children how to react during a house fire, as well as demonstrations on water safety, interacting with dogs, road safety, quad bikes, truck and cycle safety, and first aid.

The agencies involved or providing support include the Tasman District and Nelson City councils, Nelson Bays Primary Health, Police, Fire Emergency NZ, Civil Defence, New Zealand Red Cross, CET Landskills, TNL and Neltech. Rotary and the Richmond Lions provide volunteers.
