AN IMPORTANT MESSAGE TO OUR COMMUNITY The shift in alert levels announced by the Prime Minister last night was the last thing any of us wanted to hear, but here at Ngatimoti School it will be business fairly much as usual. Alert Level 2 applies for us all from midday today.

- At Alert Level 2 it is safe for all students, children and staff to attend school and early learning. There will be appropriate precautions in place.
- If your children are unwell, please do not send them to school.
- Good hand hygiene and cough and sneeze etiquette are important.
- Soap and water is great for regularly washing hands.
- For schools, children, young people and staff should be far enough away from each other so that they are not breathing on or touching each other, coupled with good hygiene practices and regular cleaning of commonly touched surfaces. There does not need to be a specific measurement but where practicable and reasonable 1 metre can be used as a guide, particularly between adults.
- Physical distancing of 2 metres is recommended for parents and caregivers, from people they don't know (to align with public health measures outside the school grounds).
- Please use the QR code poster on the office door for the NZ COVID Tracer App.
- Masks are not required at schools at Alert levels 2 and 3.

Festival is a huge event held each Labour Weekend. Over the years this has really put Ngatimoti on the map, and it has become known as one of the best festivals around. It is a

festival that many of us look forward to as we can showcase our beautiful school at the same time as providing lots of fun and fortune! This is our only school fundraiser and as such we ask that <u>all</u> parents help out. Thanks to those who have already offered to help before, during or after the day. Although we would probably like it to be a day of fun for us, it is really a weekend of work. We are the hosts and so we are here to provide a great festival for our visitors. In doing this, not only do we make lots of money but by working alongside others, we get to know people in our community. The last few years the school has benefitted by knowing our community better and through the money raised. In 2019 we were given a \$38,000 donation, in 2018 \$45,000 and in 2017 \$40,000. This money goes towards a range of things, including free stationery for all students each year, free trips and shows, refurbishment of Rathgar House, musical instruments, buying the school van, solar heating the pool, swimming lessons & te reo lessons.
