Competition Days

Touch will be run on the same days as previous touch competitions. **Juniors (Y1&2) and Intermediates (Y3-5)** on **Tuesdays**, and **Seniors (Y6-8)** on **Wednesdays**.

Transport to and from Motueka is parent's responsibility, although we are more than happy for a parent to drive the school van. The cost per player will be \$15 per student for the term, payable to school.

Player Registration Forms

Players are now required to fill out Player Registration forms upon entering the competition. These forms will still be required even if we move to Level 1 as we could move into Alert Level 2 at any moment.

This information is being collected to assist in the management of the COVID-19 pandemic. It will be given to the Ministry of Health and/or the District Health Board on request in the event that it is required for contact tracing purposes. We will not use it for any other purpose, and will destroy it 1 week after the end of the competition. It will be kept here at the Motueka Recreation Centre. Parents/Guardians have a right to access and correct any information we hold about themselves and their child/ren. This information will be kept safe and in a lock area and will only be used for contacting tracing purposes if necessary.

These forms will need to be returned to the school office and attached with the team registration form before returning it to the Motueka Recreation Centre.

At alert Level 2, touch will still be on. As the fields are spread out and there is enough room for spectators to social distance, we will meet the requirements.

If there are other family members going to support one of the players and we don't have their information, we **strongly recommend** that they scan in using the QR code on the window at the entrance to the building.

Parents of the player/s will not need to use the QR code as we will have their contact details on the Player Registration Form.

All registration forms are due at the Recreation Centre by Friday 25th September 2020 3:00pm, which is the last day of term. Please ask at the school office for player registration forms and return them to school as soon as possible if you wish to join a team.

Motueka Recreation Centre is also looking for some keen Year 7&8 students who would like to help referee the competition.

I will be holding 2 Touch referee courses on Thursday 24th September 3:30-4:45pm and Wednesday 14th October 3:30-5pm. It would be great if the students wanting to be a referee could make it to both of the training days. If they can only make it to one of the trainings that's fine.
