The front post: You may have been wondering about the 'rock post' in front of our big carving at our entranceway. This is our story of this post. After we were gifted a piece of pounamu from Paroa School on the West Coast, the Student Council started talking about the important transport route that the Motueka river was to early Māori, especially as a trading route. We wanted to show off our pounamu but learned that it is not good tikanga to stand on a precious gift, and so decided to mount it on a post where people could touch it as they walked past. We then decided that a piece of quartz to represent our precious White Rock would also be significant, as would a piece of greywacke from the river. We later learned that although there is no clear evidence of permanent settlement here for early Māori, there is a strong likelihood that people would have come ashore along here and perhaps based themselves here for short periods of time to collect kai from the forest or to rest on their journey to the coast. The rope work signifies the tying up of waka here. Special thanks to Barry Jackson for donating the rope and for his impressive rope tying skills.
