

<u>Ngatimoti Festival 2020 – Parents Group Report</u> Wow, what a successful festival it was this year! There were over 6,000 people through the gates, which was 450 more people than any other year.

The majority of school sections all made more than previous years. The Plant stall, Café, Spit and Bar all made significant increases. We made over \$12,000 just from entry fees through the gates. We were really lucky with the warm weather and the ice-creams and cold drinks sold very well.

The grounds looked amazing, due to everyone's hard work mowing and weed-eating and gardening. Many people remarked what a beautiful school we have. Most schools don't have access to the large beautiful spaces like we do.

Although we have a very small school roll at Ngatimoti school, we somehow manage to successfully run one of the biggest festivals in the district. This is because the community comes together to help us with volunteers on the day, providing access to parking, baking for the café, generous donations to the silent auction and much more. We should be really proud of what we have achieved as a community.

The people who make this festival work are too numerous to name. Everyone plays a part, whether its baking a cake for the café, working on the animal petting tent, tending to plants in the nursery months before the festival or giving up their whole long weekend to help with set-up, working on the day and then clean-up the day after. There were lots of ex-Ngatimoti school students helping on stalls and even grandparents roped in to help. Lots of members of the community also gave their time up to help on the day. This just wouldn't happen in other parts of the district.
