Room 4 created these artworks using multimedia based on the NZ artist Michael Smither's illustration for the cover of 'Go Ask That Mountain', a book about the peaceful protests that took place at Parihaka in Taranaki in the 1850s. The white feathers, representing peace, were worn by the leaders Tohutu and Te Whiti after they dreamed they were visited by an albatross and a dove who gave them the message to resist their land being taken by peaceful means rather than fighting.
