**Bikes in Schools with Sport Tasman** Tomorrow our Year 7 and 8 class will continue their biking lessons in Motueka, with Sport Tasman taking them for a controlled tour of some of the streets. Biking is a great way to exercise but does come with many risks, particularly when on the road. We do not encourage our students to bike to school until they are at least 10 years old, and even then we expect parents to teach some bike etiquette and safety skills.

With Parent-Student-Teacher meetings, everyone has had an opportunity to talk about successes to date and goals for your tamariki. As a school, we have five strategic goals; Well-being, Identity, Creativity, Literacy and Numeracy. We are regularly thinking about these goals and factoring them into our schoolwide planning. Recently a focus for well-being has been around bike and scooter safety, identity has been strengthened with Enviro activities and creativity has had a time to shine with Matariki learning.
