Happy Birthday



The Great House Group Hut Challenge begins next week!

The Student Council have organised this challenge as a part of our Science unit learning about homes and habitats, a part of our Health unit learning about Te Whare Tapa Wha and a way of using our RIVER values together. Some materials will be provided by school. These are: 10 long pieces of bamboo, one tarpaulin, binder twine. - Shelter and water proofing!

- Decorations and creative ideas



NAME THAT TRUCK! Nelson Airport's new \$1.4 million Rosenbauer Panther fire truck is on its way to New Zealand from Austria - and the airport wants help from the community to name the state of the art firefighting vehicle. The new fire truck will be operated by the Nelson Airport Rescue Fire Service. The Rosenbauer Panther is an impressive piece of equipment - it has a 700 horsepower Volvo engine, a cannon that can throw water up to 80 metres and it can blast 7000 litres of water per minute. To mark its arrival, the airport is seeking name suggestions between now and Wednesday 7 September. The winner of the naming competition will be invited to take a ride in the new fire truck and will receive a framed photograph of the experience, a \$100 Prezzy card and a \$50 voucher for Sublime Coffee at the airport.
