NZEI is the Teachers Union for primary school teachers. They are still in negotiations with the government and so primary teachers do not yet know of any outcomes. Teachers are asking for better pay, which is partly to align with the cost of living, but also so that more people are attracted to the profession and more trained teachers are retained. In many parts of NZ, it is incredibly difficult to find suitable applicants for teaching positions. Another important aspect of the negotiation is around 'time to teach, time to lead'. In effect, this claim is asking for an increase in planning time and an increase in staffing for schools. This is to better cater for students with additional learning needs. At Ngatimoti School, our Board has been funding extra teacher time in the junior room for some years now. For example, Rowena Wood, Anna Ormandy and Beth Spencer have all been funded by the Board and not the MOE. This is a luxury that most schools cannot afford. In the current negotiations, NZEI are asking for an increase in staffing so schools all get a little more teacher time paid. This is important if NZ wants to have equity in schools.
