SCHOOL BUS REMINDERS From the Ministry of Education:

- Supervise children at bus stops. It is the caregiver's responsibility to supervise children prior to boarding the school bus in the morning and once they get off the school bus in the afternoon. This is especially pertinent during the winter months as visibility is poorer due to the time of year and the weather conditions. School buses are not able to wait at bus stops for children to be collected so it is important that the caregiver is on time.
- Meet your children off the school bus on the same side of the road as the bus stops.
- It is the caregiver's responsibility to get your children to pick-up locations and collect them from drop-off locations.
- It is recommended you arrive at the bus stop at least five minutes prior to the time advised.
- Stay with your children while they are waiting for their bus in the morning and meet them in the afternoon as they get off the bus.
- Remind your children of the behaviour expectations on the school bus.
- Discuss any school transport related issues with Ali in the first instance.
