Room 4 Ski Trip How lucky are we to have a teacher who has dedicated lots of time and energy to organising a ski experience for Years 5 and 6?! It is a big responsibility for a teacher to take a school trip, and the ski trip is especially huge. Mrs Milnes has coordinated sausage sizzles to help with fund-raising, she has found extra snow clothes for some students to wear, she has sent out lots of communications to families so you all know what is happening and she has done a massive amount of behind the scenes paperwork and coordination. Thanks, Mrs Milnes, for doing all of this for the benefit of your class. One of the reasons we offer a ski trip includes giving all Year 5 and 6 students a mountain experience, so students learn new skills and use their RIVER values in a completely different environment. We expect this learning to be a bit difficult at times, but we also expect respect, innovation, positivity, excellence, and responsibility to come to the fore! Talking responsibility, there is a large financial commitment for anyone to have a ski experience. Because we opt-in to the government school donation scheme, we only ask for a donation for a trip such as this, rather than invoice families. As well, we use some Festival profits to enable all Year 5 and 6 students to have this experience. If you take your family skiing, we understand that the costs are quite high. For the school experience, we can offer a lesson, ski, poles, helmet and boot hire, shuttle bus transport up the mountain and a small contribution to parents for their petrol, for \$73 per child. We ask that you donate as much as you can towards this, to enable your child to enjoy this big day out, but not to put extra financial stress on you. Thank you, in advance, for your donation.
