RESILIENCE: Life is a lot about "We" and this is a strong message I picked up on from a recent speaker at a Principals' Conference. Dr Lucy Hone suffered a huge trauma when her 11 year old daughter, her best friend and her friend's mother all died in a car accident. Following the Christchurch earthquakes, Lucy had already written one book about resilience, and then she was plunged into coping with her own trauma. Her perspective is that nowadays people often think "Why did this happen to me?" Her advice was that this is especially unhealthy. We all need to learn that everybody goes through tough times, and we all suffer hardships. It is how we respond to these situations that helps us through them. Lucy put her energy into supporting others going through hard times, and this is what ultimately helped her.

As a community, we need to help each other out. The Ngatimoti School community has long been known to be supportive and proactive. We have a few students facing tough times and as a school we want our students to learn that bad times don't need to take over our entire being. It may be helpful to talk to your child about how the river copes when it comes up against obstacles, like boulders that block the flow. The river finds a way past, and this can be a useful analogy for children. Please know that all the staff at school want the students to be happy, and so by parents, teachers and students working together, we can usually find a pathway through tough times.

We look forward to seeing **Cas** back next term, after undergoing more surgery in Wellington. Cas and his Grandad popped in today, and we are happy to say that he is looking good!
