PET DAY 2025

The Student Council has planned a Pet Day for this coming Friday morning, 10 October. This is a fun morning for students to show their pets off! It is not compulsory to bring a pet. If you do not have a pet, you can bring a favourite teddy bear or soft toy – one per student! ©

Rules - parents please talk these through with your child

- 1. When dogs are brought to school, they need to be tied up along the back tree line fitness course area. (well separated from other dogs!) Lambs, calves and ponies can be tied up along the top of the bank or on the bottom field.
- 2. Only bring your dog if it is safe around kids, other animals and other dogs. If you are worried, please do not bring it to school.
- 3. Bring your own water container and food for your pet. For lambs, we have a fastest drinking lamb competition so please bring your own 200 ml of pre-mixed milk in a bottle for this.
- 4. Please don't lead your dog all around. Leave it tied up, and people can come and visit it!
- 5. Any poo or mess is the responsibility of the person who entered the pet!
- 6. Remember to look after your pet and not let it get stressed out.
- 7. No dogs can come on the bus. If you have a smaller animal that will <u>STAY in its</u> <u>cage</u> on the bus, you can ask your bus driver if that will be ok!
- 8. Pets need to be taken home by lunchtime.
- 9. If you want to pat someone else's animal, you should ask the owner's permission. This is for your own safety.
- 10.Do not run around the ponies and be careful and calm around all animals!

Organisation of the day

- **9 a.m.** Your dog, calf, pony or lamb should be left tied up and students need to go to class. Animals in cages (chickens, ducks, rabbits etc) are to be left on display by the sandpit. After doing the roll, teachers will take their class around to see the pets of their class members.
- **9:30 a.m.** The show ring will be on the top field. Dogs stay tied up, students with a dog or no pet are seated to watch the events. Students with any other pet are to bring the pet and start parading around the ring. There are categories like "biggest ears, shiniest coat, longest whiskers etc. LAMBS will be called in for judging first. Other pets and owners can line up and sit down in front of the audience. Then CALVES, then GOATS, PONIES and CAGED animals...
- 10 a.m. ish The dog show, which will include an obedience event of: "Sit, Stay, Come".
- **10:30 a.m. ish** Obstacle courses all animals and their owners can participate, with various courses running.

Finally, we have a dress up competition. All pets that are dressed up can parade around the ring again for this final event!

Morning teatime and lunch time will be flexible. We would like all pets, especially dogs, to be collected and taken home by about midday.

POSSIBLE STRIKE: You have probably heard about the likelihood of teachers, principals and support staff striking on Thursday 23 October. As a staff, we have discussed this at length. We feel very conflicted with closing the school for a strike because we strongly believe that attendance is important, and we are all happy in our workplace here at Ngatimoti. I want you to know that our decision to strike has not been taken lightly, but in consideration of the rest of the country's education force. Throughout the NZEI collective agreement negotiations, several issues have been raised that would support students' learning. This includes having a teacher aide in every class. (We are so fortunate at Ngatimoti School that our Board funds the majority of our teacher aide time, which includes Jade, Anna, Glenn and Davina.) Many schools cannot afford to employ teacher aides. As well, we want to attract and retain great people in our schools, rather than seeing so many leave for Australia. A strike means a day without pay for our teachers, but that is a sacrifice that we are making to try to get the government to listen.


