SPORT START Funding

Sport Start is a grant that is available through Sport Tasman. It supports young people to take part in sport and physical activity by providing assistance where financial hardship is a barrier to participation.

Details

- · Funding must be used for sport subscriptions only
- Age Group: 5-18 year olds
- Current Community Services Card holder (either in the child or guardian's name)
- Limit: Up to \$30 per child (tamariki ages 5 to 12 yrs)
- Limit: Up to \$50 per child (rangatahi ages 13 to 18 yrs)
- Up to 2 applications per calendar year per child
- Up to 2 sports can be funded on one application, however, a multi-sport application counts as your yearly allocation

PROCESS:

Sports clubs and schools must be registered as a Provider with Sport Tasman (see our website).

- Funding rounds are processed and paid out monthly, on/around the 20th (excludes Jan)
- Applications to be submitted by the 10th of the month
- Funds are paid directly to the Registered Provider School/Club/Organisation
- Any difference between fees and funding is NOT covered by Sport Tasman
- Funding must be used for sport subscriptions only: for example, it cannot be used for travel or uniforms
